

College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)*

UNT Dallas recognizes credit earned through College-Level Examinations of the College Board only if the credit is first certified by the Office of Admissions. The dean of the student's division at UNT Dallas has the option of applying CLEP credit to the student's degree audit. UNT Dallas does not grant credit on the basis of College Board CLEP General Examination scores. A student may not earn examination credit for any course failed. All general regulations for credit by examination apply to CLEP credit.

CLEP Subject Examinations

Credit is certified but not necessarily applied to a degree if the student scores at or above the average scores of those students in the national norms sample who earn a C in regular college courses on the subject. Effective July 1, 2001, CLEP began using a new "common recommended credit-granting score" for all CLEP exams. UNT Dallas recognizes CLEP credit recommendations as posted on the official student score report. The institution code for sending CLEP score reports to UNT Dallas is 3681.
